Presentation purpose:

Review of patient charts and attending and resident M&M identified learning gaps that can be addressed through IPCE. Trauma patients often present in a confusing, chaotic environment; PE is performed by multiple caregivers; a systematic approach used. Case studies & interactive discussion provided a forum to improve knowledge, understanding of systematic trauma care as well as improve interdepartmental collaboration and communication across specialties and professions.

- Develop a systematic approach to assessment to identify and prioritize all injuries.
- Recognize communication across the multidisciplinary team is vital to clinical care and outcomes.
- Identify case presentations as a venue to share information and opinions across disciplines.
