Goals and Objectives:

At the end of this lecture attendees will be able to

- Name a first and second line choice of antidepressant for treatment of Major Depressive Disorder, Generalized Anxiety Disorder and Panic Disorder
- Prepare plans to take an equitable approach to patient counseling on behavior modification strategies to reduce risks of complications, and improve outcomes related to their mental and behavioral health.
- Refer patients with suspected or diagnosed DID to mental health specialists, fostering a collaborative approach to comprehensive patient care.
- Incorporate psychological factors into their overall patient assessment, recognizing the influence of mental health on physical well-being.
- 5. Educate patients about their prescribed psychiatric medications, including expected outcomes, possible side effects, and the importance of adherence.
- 6. Demonstrate a cognitive behavior therapy technique for use in the primary care visit
- 7. Communicate effectively with families and caregivers about the diagnosis, prognosis, and progression of dementia, ensuring a compassionate and empathetic approach.


