Presentation purpose:

Palliative care is specialized care that focuses on improving quality of life (QOL) through relief of stress and symptoms for patients with serious illness. Palliative care is appropriate for any patient in the advanced stages of illness, including patients with heart failure (HF). HF patients not only suffer from dyspnea, fatigue, pain, nausea, anxiety, and depression, leading to significant psychosocial distress for both patients and their caregivers. Advance care planning and complex shared decision making become increasingly important as HF progresses.

Learning objectives:

- Learn about the unpredictable nature of heart failure prognostication and what therapies improve symptoms and quality of life, not just survival
- Explore the burdensome symptoms of heart failure beyond dyspnea and how the ejection fraction does not predict survival in order heart failure patients
- Understand the value of thoughtful discussions and when to engage palliative care or hospice
