Presentation purpose:

The occurrence of bleeding at times other than expected menses is common. Up to one-third of women will experience abnormal uterine bleeding in their life, with irregularities most commonly occurring at menarche and perimenopause. Attendees will learn normal uterine anatomy and physiology as a basis to understand how abnormalities of these processes lead to abnormal uterine bleeding.

- Describe the normal physiology of the menstrual cycle and sites in which this process can be disrupted
- Describe the components of the PALM-COEIN acronym for evaluating and classifying abnormal uterine bleeding
