Presentation purpose:

Older adults represent a large proportion of hospitalized patients. Older adults are at high risk for functional decline, adverse reactions to medications, and unrecognized conditions that can lead to increased morbidity and even death. Geriatric expertise and a systems approach can optimize outcomes for older adults and patients of all ages with multiple chronic conditions. This lecture will provide learners with information needed to participate actively in interdisciplinary teams committed to implementing changes in clinical care that will improve outcomes for patients with complex care needs regardless of age.
